






### HSIP – Highway Safety Improvement Program


- Core <u>Federal</u> Aid Program SAFETEA-LU (2005)
- Reduce K & A Crashes on all public roads
- Data Driven, Strategic Approach to Safety
- Low Cost High Impact solution preferred
- 90% Federal, 10% local contribution
- Subject to Federal Criteria for Contracting
  - DCP , EEO, DBE, Buy America, NEPA
  - Competitive bidding acquisition of material & labor
- Competitive selection process (Application ≠ Award)

#### 2020 Traffic Volumes: massive drop in vehicles


**Monthly Average Vehicle Traffic Volumes** 






#### **2021 Traffic Volumes: returning to baseline**





Wednesday before Thanksgiving	Applications DUE to SafetyProject.DOT@state.mn.us
December - January	Selection Committee scoring
February	Finalization and Award Letters

<sup>\* -</sup> Coordinate early with MPOs, DOT, City and other relevant jurisdictions on application or projects



#### **MPOs**

- Application process
- MPO involvement

MPOs are federally required to, through continuous, cooperative, and comprehensive planning, with the State and public transportation operators to develop metropolitan transportation plans (MTPs) and Transportation Improvement Programs

#### Reminder

#### Application ≠ Selection

- Encouraged to submit projects even if the target for the ATP may be exceeded
- Unallocated money from other ATPs or FY may be awarded to projects from other ATPs
- If project is within MPO boundaries, coordinate and get letter of support from them
- If working with District, you need a letter of support from your District Traffic Engineer for projects involving MnDOT highways
- Partnering with other LPAs (multi county project scored higher)
- Flexibility in year of funding, or being able to deliver early looked at favorably
